

Found unconscious in Karawal school, boy dies in hospital

A 14-year-old boy, who was found unconscious under mysterious circumstances in his classroom in a private school in northeast Delhi's Karawal Nagar area on Thursday morning, later died in a hospital.

Avdesh alias Prince, a Class VII student of the Saraswati Gyan Public School in Shiv Vihar, allegedly had a scuffle with a classmate following which he fell unconscious. The school authorities rushed him to a nearby hospital where he died.

DCP (Northeast) Dr A K Singla said, "We have apprehended the classmate of the deceased. Further legal action will be taken. Since there were no apparent injury marks on the body of the boy, we are going to question other classmates as to what exactly happened."

Police said that they received a call at around 11:45 am that a boy died at a private nursing home in Indrapuri. As per the allegations levelled by the victim's family, he was beaten by a group of students.

"In the morning, Prince left home saying that he is going to meet his friends. Hours later, we received a call from the police that our child is dead. We are sure that he was tortured and beaten by his classmates," his relatives said.

The Government had declared Thursday holiday for the schools in Delhi on account of Chhath puja.

Police said that they have registered a case at the Karawal Nagar police station. The body will be handed over to his family after post-mortem examination. The police are questioning the minor boy, who allegedly got into a quarrel with the deceased.

Conjoined twins separated at AIIMS, but critical

The condition of the conjoined twins, Jaga and Kalia, from Odisha remains "critical" after a marathon surgery to separate them by a team of doctors at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), a senior doctor at the hospital said on Thursday.

The 28-month-old twins, who were joined from their heads, were successfully separated after an 18-hour-long surgery which started at 9:00 am yesterday and ended at

3:00 am today, he said.

According to the doctor, the twins are on ventilator and their condition is critical. They are under observation and are being monitored by a team of experts constantly. They are also being given blood transfusion continuously.

A team of about 30 specialists from the institute's neurosurgery, neuro-anaesthesia and plastic surgery departments performed the second phase of the marathon surgery.

The twins, hailing from Milipada village under Phiringia block in Kandhamal district in Odisha, are cran-

iopagus conjoined twins, joined at the heads. This is a very rare condition, doctors said.

The first phase of the surgery was performed on August 28 when the doctors created venous bypass to separate the veins shared by the babies that return blood to the heart from the brain. The conjoined twins were admitted in the AIIMS on July 13.

A K Mahapatra, the chief of the neurosciences centre, earlier had said the twins suffer from the condition which afflicts one in 30 lakh children, of which 50 per cent die either at birth or within 24 hours.

Boy shot dead in south-west Delhi

A 24-year old boy was shot dead by another in south-west Delhi's Malikpur village on Wednesday evening following an altercation.

Police said a group of boys were drinking by the roadside in the village when two among them had a scuf-

fle and one of them identified as Monu, a resident of the village, shot at the other boy identified as Sachin Lakhra, resident of Ranhoula village.

Locals gathered at the spot and made a PCR call, after which Lakhra was rushed to the nearby Rao Tula Ram Hospital and later

shifted to Balaji Action Hospital where he succumbed to his injuries.

Police has registered a case of murder and have detained a few people for questioning, including Monu, his father and one Anil. No arrest has been made in the case yet.

Further investigations are on.

Nilgai's mutilated body parts found in Aravalli Retreat

The mutilated parts of a blue bull (nilgai) were found in an area near the Ansal Aravalli Retreat under the Raisina zone here, a forest official said on Thursday.

Nilgais are found here and in Sultanpur, Farukhnagar, Jhajjar areas of Haryana.

"We have found the head and a leg of the animal. There was blood all over the place," District Forest Officer Shyam Sunder Kaushik said. The area has around 300 farmhouses and residents suspect that it could be an act of poachers who wanted its meat, he said.

"The incident came to the fore this morning when a guard spotted the head and a leg of the nilgai in the F-Block area. He immediately informed our office after which the wildlife department was informed," Kaushik said.

This is the first such incident and it is a matter of grave concern, he said. "We are going to register an FIR in this matter against unknown persons at the Bhondsi police station," Kaushik added.

Swiss couple on way to recovery

The young Swiss couple, who was allegedly attacked in Agra's Fatehpur Sikri by a group of youth on Sunday, is on the way to recovery, doctors at the Apollo Hospital where they are undergoing treatment said on Thursday.

Quentin Jeremy Clerc, 24, who came to India on September 30 with his female friend Marie Droz, also 24, was quoted as saying in a news report that they were strolling near the railway station at the Fatehpur Sikri in Agra when a group started following them and later attacked them.

Dr Rajendra Prasad, neurosurgeon at the Apollo Hospital said Clerc has been shifted to a room from the ICU. The doctor said that Droz has a fracture in the arm but has been discharged after treatment.

"We have moved him out of the ICU. He is having a hearing problem otherwise he is conscious and talking," said Prasad. The doctor informed that it is difficult to say at the moment whether the hearing problem will be a permanent one.

"He's improving but we will have to see in the long

term," said the doctor. He added that Droz, who has a fracture in her arm, has been discharged, but at present is with her friend. Prasad said that the duo is in shock after the incident.

According to the report, the couple from Lausanne in Switzerland was chased and attacked with stones and sticks by a group of youth in Fatehpur Sikri on Sunday, leaving them battered and bruised.


They said that as they lay on the ground bloodied and bruised, bystanders began taking videos of them on their mobile phones, according to the report.

Swamy's PIL on Sunanda's death is political litigation: HC

The Delhi High Court on Thursday dismissed a PIL filed by BJP leader Subramanian Swamy for a court-monitored SIT probe into the death of Congress MP Shashi Tharoor's wife Sunanda Pushkar.

Termining it as "political interest litigation", the High Court said it is "unfortunate that the court is being used in



Swamy said that the court is being used in this manner." A division bench of Justices S Muralidhar and IS Mehta said

that "courts should be careful in not letting the judicial machinery being used by political personalities for their own purposes".

"This is perhaps a textbook example of political interest litigation dressed up as public interest litigation," the bench remarked while dismissing Swamy's petition.

The court said it was not satisfied that this plea can be entertained as PIL (Public

Interest Litigation). The court added it is unable to persuade that investigation being carried out by the SIT is "botched up or under the influence of anyone". "The court expects the SIT will take the investigation to its logical conclusion."

During the hearing, the court asked Additional Solicitor General Sanjay Jain appearing for the Delhi Police and the Centre whether he subscribes to the allegation that the husband of the late Pushkar had made attempts to influence the Government to hush up the case and continue to influence the probe.

Jain replied in the negative, saying he does not subscribe to these allegations and there is no question of the Delhi Police being influenced or evidence washed up.

In his petition, Swamy said there has been constant attempt to block the investigation and alleged that the registration of an FIR took almost a year and

nothing has happened after that.

The plea had alleged that "very influential people are involved in the case, leading to attempts to protect them and the matter has faced a lot of unnecessary delay already".

At the outset, the bench asked Swamy to explain the basis of the allegations made in his petition as averments were made against a person who belongs to a political party in opposition and why he has not put up the evidence in support of the allegations.

"Which part of your petition is based on your personal knowledge and which part is based on belief?" the court asked. Swamy cannot make such "sweeping allegation", said the bench, as he sought time to file a separate affidavit to give details of the basis of his petition.

The court said: "You (Swamy) said in your affidavit that you have not concealed

any information. Today when we ask you to explain the basis of your allegations, you say you will file another affidavit. That means you have concealed information."

The court also questioned Swamy for not stating anywhere in his petition that he is a leader of the BJP and that the person against whom he was making the allegation was from the Congress. The court also refrained from imposing any cost on Swamy for filing the PIL.

Swamy said: "This is not my first PIL. I know how the court works. This is the first time I have been questioned like this. I have been a Law Minister. What you are asking me is tantamount to accusing me of concealing evidence."

The bench clarified that nothing said in the court's order should be construed as having said anything on the investigation which is underway.
